Construction of garage behind building, 28 x 56 feet. fall within 100-foot buffer zone. proposing to extend end of pavement with entrance to garage. limit of work follows the 25-foot buffer with no work proposed within. little grading proposed for each side of he building, rear remains the same.

Bill, Azu and Dave site visit –owner was informed to stop work, no digging or fill. issues because foudation has been complete. erosion in place, not sufficient needs haybales and silk fence. wetland line agred by members to be accurate.

John Noblin - no fill - 280 church street, a few weeks did test holes and dug foundation, no fill.

Dave – filled was pushed and when test pits are done, con com use shovel or augur used for test pits, no digging. work should not have been done.

Reynolds – slope in back, that is why con com is requesting haybale and silk fence.

Gallagher – stake erosion control, inform con com.

dave - no further work

will – need to have in writing. further work noted between permits and paperwork that any enforcement fines will be retroactive to todays meeting.

will – max amount for fines per day\$300

Campbell - asked if ther was a stream in the top portion of the property -

aza - stream with standing water

Noblin – cluster building proposed – planning board requested wetline line verified. one parcel

FD – emergency access from river as an access point

Evan - maple ave is an old road made of road with water bleeding through and across the road, proposing to pick up in culvert to drain downward

Watson - isolated to remain as it with some piping for stormwater.
